

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### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

REED Nepal is providing teacher training programme for improving quality of school level. The programme strongly supported the MDG, EFA, and SSRP goals for effective service delivery. Teacher training program was providing support for 70 schools from eight Village Development Committees (VDCs) of the lower Solukhumbu and 65 schools from 9 VDC of upper part of Solukhumbu.

Due to the teacher training programme effective implementation, rest of the areas schools are requested to the programme extension. The course is fully accredited by the Nepal Council for Education Development (NCED) and has been identified as a model for educational development in Nepal.

Teacher training programme is going to the start in Shikha VDC of Myagdi districts, covered six schools for base line survey.

This report covered mainly the current available school physical facilities, number of schools, number of working teachers, number of students, student teachers attendance rate, drop out rate, pass rate, student learning environment, and teaching learning process current situation of 6 schools. The report prepared based on the survey form, flash form of school, observation of team and interaction with stakeholder provided information.

### 1. BACKGORUND OF THE PROJECT AREA

Myagdi is mountain district and situated in Dhawalgiri, western part of Nepal. Regular transportation service is black top moterable road up to Baglung and rough muddy road to Ghara and Shikha via Beni from Kathmandu and 2 days walking via Ghorepani is main trekking route from Pokhara . Total area of Baglung is 2298 squar kilomiter. In Total 41VDCs covered. Highest mountain of the zone Mt. Annapura 8091mtr) and Dhawalagiri (8167mtr) in Dhawalagiri region. Inhabitant of Myagdi is Magar and Brahman/Chettri but Shikha VDC dominated by Magar cast. Total population of Myagdi is 114447 (Census 2001). Out of total population 53.5 % (61269) are fenmale and 46.5% (51178) are male. In total 268 Schools, 154 PS, 37 LSS, 32 SS, 17 HS community (government) and 28 private schools are running all over the district. According to District Education Office data total 34816 students are studying grade 1 to grade 10 in community schools and 1241 teachers are working at the all school.

The new project area (Shikha VDC) covers the 6 schools. This area is starting 3 hours vehicles service from district headquarter Beni to Shikha. Total population of Shikha VDC are 7065 (census 2001 and projection 2011) and children are enrolled in school (Baseline survey 2011). In this VDC total 51 teachers are teaching in all level (ECD, Primary and Lower Secondary).

This new project area, there are 4 primary schools and 1 secondary school and 1 higher secondary schools are running. A private (class 1-5) English medium school is running in shikha Chitre village.

### 4. METHODOLOGY

The following tools are used for data collection and studies:

Survey data collection forms (see annex), Teachers class teaching observation form (see annex), Field visit observation, interaction with Teachers, SMC and students, use flash report forms of school.

### 5. DATA ANALYSIS

### 5.1 Physical facilities

- 80 % of school has electricity facilities. Like wise 5 villages have electricity facilities.
- Approximately 4 schools can receive health facilities with in 30 minute to 2 hours walking distance rest schools can receive with less than 30 minutes walk. Shikha VDC has health post at VDC headquarter.
- 1 higher secondary education available more then 2 hours walking distance from settlement.
- 50% of schools has received ECD class quota from DEO.
- Only 25 % of ECD classes are running separately from grade 1. Rests of the ECD class are run with grade 1.
- 80% (4) of schools has enough classrooms for separate class teaching but 2 schools has very small classroom.
- Only one school has good child friendly furniture. Rests of the schools furniture are very long, attached and repairable.
- 100% of school has enough.
- 100% of school have compound wall.
- 100% of school has safe and managed drinking water available.
- 50 % of schools have separate and 50% schools have combined toilet facilities.
- 2 schools provided library and one school have laboratory facilities. All high schools have library but not enough books for small aged children or young children. Almost school have old used books but not properly arrange as a library.
- All of school has whiteboard in each classroom.
- 80% Schools has computer and printer for officeial use and Paudwar secondary school has computer facility for students.

### 5.2 Primary, Lower Secondary and Secondary Teachers Profiles of 6 Schools

- Total 64.7 % (33) male and 35.3% (18) female teachers are teaching in primary to secondary level
- 39.2 % (20) teachers are SLC passed and 4.9% are under SLC
- 64.7% (33) teachers are primary, 13.4% are lower secondary and others teachers are in secondary level
- 39.2% teachers are permanent (government) and 9.8 percent are from organisation support and 13.7 % teachers are from school income.
- more than 25% teachers has 11-20 years teaching experienced in different levels and 23.5% teachers has more than 20 years teaching experienced.
- 35.3% teacher has taken 10 months government package training and 39.2% teachers are trained from educational college
- only 19.6% teachers untrained teachers in all level

### 5.3 Classroom organisation and management

- in all school found clean and tidy and sufficient light in the classroom
- 33% schools have (in some classroom) students and teachers made charts display in the classroom.
- 17% schools has hanging teaching learning materials in the classroom
- seating arrangement of students in row in all schools
